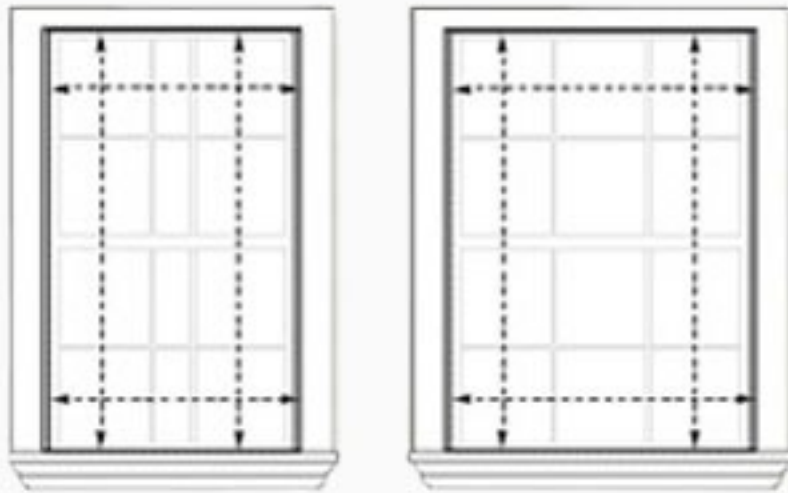


Typically, windows narrower than 28" are covered with a single panel.

Windows greater than 32" are usually covered with 2 panels.

Windows in most houses fall in between this range and can be covered with either 1 or 2 panels, if you choose 3.5" or 4.5" louvers. Acadia recommends shutters with 2.5" louvers be no wider than 28".

Over 32", Two Panels

Acadia recommends that customers select a single maximum panel size between 28" and 32." Any windows with a width greater than this will have 2 panels.

Any windows with a width less than this will have a single panel.

This will ensure a consistent panel size throughout the house.

Acadia's standard maximum panel width is 28".

### Single Panel

A single panel can offer a clean, open look that allows maximum light to enter the home.

However, when these panels are swung open into the room, they swing wide and are more likely to be obstructed by furniture.



### Two Panels

Covering windows with two panels offers a more traditional look. Because each panel swings outward to the left and right, a shutter with two panels is also easier to open.

Additionally, with two narrow panels, louvers lay against one another more tightly when the louvers are closed, blocking the maximum amount of light.
